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"Our Anchor of Hope"

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you." (1 Peter 1:3-4)

As I write this we've just celebrated Easter, the great event which gives us hope in every circumstance of life. The resurrection of Jesus is God's declaration that, because Jesus lives, we will also live, not only now but forever with Him. The resurrection of Jesus is God's declaration that nothing can separate of us from Him and His love.

Dr. William Brown, former president of Cedarville University, reflected on an experience he had on one of his travels to Russia. He wrote:

"As I walked down the streets of Moscow I felt conspicuous and could not figure out why. I wanted to blend in but it was obvious people knew I was not Russian. I asked the group of educators with whom I was working whether I was noticeable because of my clothes: jeans and a Chicago Bulls shirt.

"'No, it's not your clothes,' they replied "What is it then?' I asked.

"The dozen or so teachers huddled together and talked for several minutes. One of them, speaking for the group finally answered politely, 'It's your face.'

"'My face!' I laughed. 'How does my face look different?'

"They talked again and then one of the teachers stood and quietly said, 'You have hope."

All too often we think of hope as nothing more than wishful thinking, as some kind of longing or desire. We don't normally think of hope as a certainty.

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But Biblical hope is the anchor for our life. Hope gives all things meaning and promise. Hope is a confident expectation that everything God has promised will come to pass. Therefore, hope is an eager anticipation of a guaranteed future. As St. Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 15: "If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be more pitied than all men."

Christian hope, grounded on the sure and certain promises of God, causes us to live life differently than those without it. Paul wrote to the Thessalonians: "We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope." The grief death brings, while painful, does not crush us because we have God's promise that He has defeated death and we have His promise that we will be with our loved ones who have died in Christ again.

Hope allows us to admit that this life is temporary, that the things of this world are here one day and gone the next and yet not be overwhelmed with a sense of meaninglessness.

In his article Dr. Brown reflected on the movie *Hope Floats* saying, "This movie attempted to salvage a positive attitude toward life in the face of adultery, divorce, and depression. The message of the movie is, that no matter what happens, we must go on with our lives." And if you have nothing to attach yourself to, that's all you can do.

According to the movie, like flotsam that floats on the sea, floating on the waves, hope floats above a world where bad things happen for no reason. Put on a happy face and maybe things will get better, maybe there's something good around the corner.

This is not Biblical hope. The hope the Bible speaks of is an anchor for the soul. In fact, ultimately, the hope that the Bible points to is Jesus, Himself. It's the living hope of the living Christ whose victorious resurrection has gained for us an inheritance that is eternal because we have been made children of God.

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Easter gives us the certainty that this eternal inheritance is already ours. Our hope is not based on what we see around us. It is based on what God has already done. Our hope is focused on the homeland which God has guaranteed is ours already.

And there is the key! As God's people we have been shown the ending. We know that, through Christ, the war is already over. Christ is the winner and we are the ones who receive the rewards of His victory.

This is not an escape from life. We still live each day and face each circumstance that comes our way. But we do not do it alone and we have the promise no matter what we go through, we have a blessed future in store for us. This is the kind of certainty with which we were truly meant to live.

So, in certainty of Christ's Easter victory, "may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." (Romans 15:13)

But as the facade that protects them proves increasingly tenuous, Noa and Astrid must decide whether their friendship is enough to save one another—or if the secrets that burn between them will destroy everything.



4 Year Old Class

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We started off last month with a new student. This makes 27 total for Pre- K, we're so excited! The Preschool teachers and Pastor Brooks attended a Seminar on April 8th at Beautiful Savior in Boise. The topic was 'Stronger Together - Building Strength in Staff Relationships.' I'm glad we all went as a team. We gained some helpful knowledge and got to tour their facility.

Our Bible verses were focused around Easter and this month will finish going through the Bible stories. Some of the students favorite crafts were: making cherry blossom trees using pink tissue paper, making a carrot garden with paper plates, lamb puppets, sorting colorful fruit on skewers for snack, fork painting a flower garden, painting with golf balls, using pastels over tape to then reveal a cross, and water colors. Our 10 caterpillars are now cocoons and we're eagerly anticipating

their transformation into butterflies. Our red beets are a few inches tall and we'll soon plant sweet corn. The kids enjoy watching things sprout and grow. Some have transplanted everything we grow here into their own gardens at home.



As the end of the school year draws near we've been concentrating on lower case letters, all the shapes, colors, numbers and how to spell them. For Math we've been using Unifex cubes and tag bags; both are hands-on tools to help better understand concepts. They continue to do groupings, patterns, addition and subtraction with these types of manipulatives. We're practicing songs for the end of the year celebration which is on Thursday, May 18th at 6:30 in the Sanctuary. This school year sure flew by, but what a blessing the students have been. We pray that we helped in 'Building a spiritual & educational foundation for living in His grace,' like our class motto states. Thank you to all the families for entrusting your children with us.

"He is not here: He is risen!" Matthew 28:6. The children learned this verse for April. Their confidence shows when they eagerly recite the verse in front of their classmates. April brought many rain showers and helped to build the children's chalk-drawing skills under the picnic shelter. The

rain didn't know to hold off for recess and it didn't stop us from going outside. We built robots out of recyclable items for Earth Day. The children were a little hesitant about how to do this but once they let their imagination take over they really got into it. We decorated a cross with live flowers, we painted a large cardboard cross and made it look like stained glass, traced, cut and painted a paper cross, used floor tape to make a 3 cross painted picture (we made a lot of crosses in April), we also made butterflies and flowers out of coffee filters, cut their grass they planted, and observed what happens to newly planted flowers if they do not get water. Yes, we forgot to water the plants but the children saw how the plants "recovered" just by giving them water.

Our Bible verse for this month is "Trust the Lord with all your heart." Proverbs 3:5a. This month will mainly be a review of colors, shapes, letters & numbers. It will also include the ocean, fresh/salt water, animals in the ocean, Cinco de Mayo, and Mother's Day. The children took home the flowers they planted. We hope you were all able to find a spot in your garden or home for them to continue to grow.
