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"All I Really Need to Know..."?

"These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." (John 20:31)

More than thirty years ago, Robert Fulghum, a former minister of the Unitarian Church, wrote the book "All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten: Uncommon Thoughts on Common Things." Since its first printing this little book has sold more than seven million copies and been translated into 27 languages.

Fulghum has a special ability to translate the complex matters of life into very simple words, words just about anyone can understand and relate to. As popular as that book has been, it's likely that you may have read it at one time or another.

In the preface he writes, "Most of what I really need to know about how to live, what to do, and how to be, I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate school mountain, but there in the sandbox at Sunday School."

Here is a list of the most basic things he says he learned there:

- 1. Share everything.
- 2. Play fair.
- 3. Don't hit people.
- 4. Put things back where you found them.
- 5. CLEAN UP YOUR OWN MESS.
- 6. Don't take things that aren't yours.
- 7. Say you're SORRY when you HURT somebody.
- 8. Wash your hands before you eat.
- 9. Flush.
- 10. Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you.
- 11. Live a balanced life learn some and drink some and draw some and paint some and sing and dance and play and work every day some.
- 12. Take a nap every afternoon.
- 13. When you go out into the world, watch out for traffic, hold hands, and stick together.
- 14. Be aware of wonder. Remember the little seed in the Styrofoam cup: The roots go down and the plant goes up and nobody really knows how or why, but we are all like that.
- 15. Goldfish and hamster and white mice and even the little seed in the Styrofoam cup they all die. So do we.
- 16. And then remember the Dick-and-Jane books and the first word you learned - the biggest word of all -LOOK."

He even gives a shout out to Idaho in the book when he writes: "I get tired of hearing it's a crummy world and that people are no good. What kind of talk is that? I know a place in Payette, Idaho, where a cook and a waitress and a manager put everything they've got into laying a chicken-fried steak on you." However, as popular as this book has been, Fulghum missed something. Something very simple. The most important thing.

Unfortunately, he missed the message of the cross.

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This is especially sad in light of the fact that he says that he learned these things in the kindergarten of his Sunday School. In fact, he strikes at the heart of God's message of grace and mercy when he writes: "It wasn't in books. It wasn't in a church. What I needed to know was out there in the world. Remember, most of us got something for nothing the first time just by showing up here at birth. Now we have to qualify."

It's a sad Sunday School and a sad church that claims to be Christian that doesn't teach the importance of the Christ who died to demonstrate how important we are to the God who made us. And then tells us that the life we have been given as a gift from God has been given to us so that we can demonstrate that the rest of life is about "qualifying". The only way I can understand that word is that we have to somehow prove to God and others that we are people of value. This is exactly the opposite of grace

If the message of the cross, the Gospel of salvation is missing, then all the other things we learned in kindergarten (or in growing up), as helpful as they might be in life, just aren't enough.

With the Reverend Fulghum, we can certainly agree that "Sticks and stones may break our bones, but words will break our hearts," but that's not nearly enough. We need the simple "*wisdom of God*" (1 Cor. 2:7) St. Paul speaks of when he wrote: "*I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified*." (1 Cor. 2:2).

Admittedly, had Fulghum mentioned Christ and His cross, his book would not have sold as many copies or put him on track to write the other books which followed. After all, *"the word of the cross is follow to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."* (1 Cor. 1:18). But unlike an author trying to sell books, we aren't constrained. We may speak freely and courageously to the hope that is within us.

It is important to share, to play fair, to say you're sorry, and even to flush. Warm cookies are good, even if they're not good for you. But the most important word is not "the first word you learned" from Dick and Jane. The most important Word is the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ and Him crucified.

God's blessings to you as we live out our faith together in this broken world and I'll see you in church.








To pay the registration fee and/or monthly tuition, you may do so with:


