

The Solace House — a new home is opening for child victims of sex trafficking.

What is the Solace House?

Idaho Anti-Trafficking Coalition, Inc. - Solace House exists to provide a home for girls 12-18 years of age who are victims of sex trafficking. Solace House will serve children in Idaho, but will collaborate with other states throughout the United States as a possible placement.

Where will the Solace House be located?

Solace House will be located in the Boise area in an undisclosed location.

What type of services will Solace House provide?

A child/youth might be a victim of sex trafficking within the family structure or through force, abduction, fraud or coercion. Children/youth need a sense of belonging and ongoing reassurances of value and worth. Therefore, Solace House is a residential care facility that provides trauma informed care, group and individual therapy, supports, life skills, and opportunities for physical activities and peer interaction for the purpose of restoration and rehabilitation.

How long will victims be able to stay at the Solace House? Children/youth can stay at the Solace House for up to two years and when ready, a case manager will work on transitional services for a permanent placement.

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CHRISTIAN BY GOD'S CHOOSING!

"Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy."

1 Peter 2:10

Last past month I preached a sermon series from Ephesians titled "What in the World is the Church Supposed to Do". One repeating theme in that series was the idea that, as God's people, we are unique, different. I think about and struggle with this regularly. As a child of God, how am I different from those around me who don't know and trust in Jesus?

In a book titled "Christ Esteem" the author makes this statement: "I know a woman who works at the counseling center of a large university. In describing the staff she said, 'These are some of the most loving, kind, compassionate people I have ever met, yet, they are all atheists.'

I've found this to be true, as well. In our society there are many very kind, caring, loving people who really could care less about God, who, in fact, are often antagonistic toward God and Christianity in particular.

It's obvious that what makes us different as God's people is not that we are necessarily more caring or helpful than people who aren't Christians. While we are to strive to show forth God's love in these ways, the truth of the matter is, we can often act rather "unChristian-like". And at those times, if the difference between being Christian or non-Christian is determined by our actions, does that mean we are no longer Christians? Does our sinful behavior mean we are no longer the people of God?

Of course not!

You see, the one thing that makes us different as Christians is the fact that we have been called into a personal relationship with God through the power of His Holy Spirit and chosen to be His people.

Peter says it this way: "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." 1 Peter 2:9-10

We are Christians, the people of God, because of God's calling, God's choosing. In His kindness and mercy He chose you to be His own. It's this, and only this, that makes you different from other people who have no relationship with God.

Despite our many faults and the fact that we don't always act like His people, God chose us anyway. This is a wonderful and freeing truth. It's wonderful because it assures us that God loves us at all times. And it's freeing because we are free to develop and deepen our relationship with a loving and merciful Father rather than attempting to win His love and favor with our acts of goodness and love.

Each September the calendar at church begins to fill up as we kick off our Fall activities. One glance will quickly show you that we are beginning a very busy month.

But September is also very exciting as we have the opportunity to renew our commitment to grow in our faith through Bible study and deepen our relationship with God and one another as we gather regularly for worship (especially after the busy summer activities).

If you've grown a little complacent in your worship pattern, make a commitment to come to worship regularly once more. And take part in one (or more) of the Bible study classes being offered. This year on Sunday morning we are offering two different studies:




We have 12 students (7 boys, 5 girls) this year in our morning class. We will not be holding any additional sessions because we did not get enough registrations to do so.


