

Flahiff Funeral Chapel has donated several 2020 calendars. They are located in the entry way on the counter.




ATTENTION Crafters & Quilters—

A BIRTHDAY PARTY?

"Hear the snow crunch, see the kids bunch, this is Santa's big scene. In the air there's a feeling of Christmas."

Christ is a time for love and good cheer among family and friends

Ever notice how so much of the way Christ is celebrated has little to nothing to do with Christ? News media tells us the essence of Christmas is giving coats or food to the needy. Movies and TV specials pour on the syrup, sending the message that Christmas is some festival of human love and good cheer or a time when miracles happen and life is rosy and happy.

While being charitable and loving those around you are very good things, they aren't the essence of Christmas.

The essence of Christmas is that God became a man, took on human flesh, in order complete a mission He had foretold in the Garden of Eden. He entered our sinful world to save sinful humanity through the One who would crush the head of the serpent but, in so doing, be struck by that serpent and die.

That's the real reason for the "holyday" that is celebrated every December 25th. Christmas is remembering and celebrating the birthday of the King of kings and Lord of lords, "God in man made manifest."

When we celebrate birthdays we typically do certain things. And God is no different.

Invitations

When we celebrate a birthday we often have a party. Invitations are sent out to family and friends with the hope that they will demonstrate that it's an important event to them by showing up.

God did the same thing. When His Son was born He sent an invitation to the shepherds. But He didn't trust this most important of invites to the postal service. This event deserved nothing but the most trusted messengers – a delegation of angels.

They came declaring, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior,

who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." Luke 2:10-12

We might not be invited the same way today but the invitation comes to us in His Word. There He invites all people to come and worship the newborn King.

Gifts

The magi (or as they are often called, the Wisemen) received an invitation as well. They saw the sign of his coming in a star which guided them to Jesus and His parents. And they did something that often happens at birthdays — they gave the birthday boy gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

Christmas is a time of a lot of gift giving. Trees will be crowded with beautifully wrapped packages and people will eagerly look to see if their name is on them.

But nothing can surpass the greatest gift of Christmas. God Himself gives us all that we have out of His divine love and mercy even though we don't deserve it. As John declared: "God so loved the world that He GAVE His one and only Son...." John 3:16

Songs

A birthday party would not be complete without the song "Happy birthday to you..." (often sung off key). But nothing can compare to the song of the angels as they sang that night, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." Luke 2:14

On Christmas day, all around the world, God's people will sing songs of joy, songs which retell the reason for our joy. "Angels we have heard on high" proclaiming "Christ the Savior is born." O come all ye faithful" and see "This Great and Might Wonder". We must "Go tell it on the mountain."

These songs of joy and praise warm our hearts and bring back memories of Christmases past as they declare our present joy that Christ is born to set us free.

What we do and have done at Christmas – the traditions, the parties, the presents – these are all good things. But we must always remember whose birthday we celebrate.

2019-2021 Mission Grant #4 LAMP Ministry Inc. - \$100,000

LAMP Ministry Inc. has ministered for nearly 50 years in northern Canada where many villages are reachable only by aircraft or seasonal roads. Currently, nearly one million Indigenous people live in these isolated areas with about half of them under the age of 14. The most alarming statistic is that over 15 percent of children and youth will actually take their own lives out of despair and hopelessness. When LAMP goes into these communities with VBS, Bible studies, and personal witnessing, these communities will have access to Christian education for faith in Christ. In order to fulfill their mission of sharing the gospel in the next few years, LAMP will need to expand their staff of full-time missionary pilots to four or five. LAMP will need to recruit and train 100 to 200 more volunteer missionaries committed to serve at least five years. This grant will provide the funds to help LAMP reach their goal.

What is Visual Discrimination?

Visual discrimination is the ability to tell the difference between objects or symbols by sight including color, shape, size, and orientation. This skill is developmental; children will become more successful with visual discrimination activities as they begin to mature.

Why is Visual Discrimination Important?

Young children in preschool and kindergarten need to have good visual discrimination skills to start identifying letters and numbers. Visual discrimination skills will help children to notice the similarities and differences in letters like b and d or x and y. Visual discrimination skills are also important when classifying.


