Does Lent have to be gloomy?

I heard a comment by someone more than once that "Lent seems so gloomy". Maybe it the time of the year as winter still keeps raising it dreary head. Maybe it's the holdover of shorter days with less sunshine. Does Lent have to be gloomy? There are several Biblical and historical things that we might look at to answer this question.

Historically, in the early church, the 40 days prior to Easter were a time of intense preparation for those who were being instructed in the faith and would be baptized into the faith and make their commitment to faith in our Lord Jesus as their Savior and Lord. Thus, it was a time of instruction and spiritual growth. Public penance was used for serious sins of new believers as evidence of discipleship. Gradually that was replaced by private penance.

Everyday practices of the faith life that Jesus talks about in the Sermon on the Mount as recorded in Matthew 6, which were part of the Jewish faith life, were extended as good practices for developing a pious and God-fearing life. Giving to the needy, prayer and fasting were three pillars of practice spoken of by our Lord in the Sermon on the Mount as important but not to do them in a showy fashion.

The observation of Lent, while not commanded anywhere in Scripture is a good practice of the faith if done for the strengthening of one's faith. In flood story, 40 days of rain God cleansed the earth in physical, moral and spiritual impurity through water even as he saved Noah and his family. Moses was 40 days on the mountain before God gave the Ten Commandments. Elijah was 40 days on a spiritual journey as well as the 40 days of temptation of our Lord as he began his ministry. Thus 40 becomes a number associated with a spiritual journey, especially one of preparation.

Do we have to observe Lent? No! No more than we have to celebrate Christmas as part of the church year or Thanksgiving or Independence Day as part of our national calendar. Yet there is benefit if used and observed appropriately. Does it have to be gloomy? No! But certainly, the somberness of our Lord's preparation for suffering and death are a part of the story of our salvation. By growing in appreciation of that portion of His work on our behalf it enriches our understanding of God's grace and how much richer our understanding of the victory that is Christ's and ours through Easter. Lent is always be forward looking to that great event of the resurrection.

As the writer of Ecclesiastes says, **1** For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: 2 a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; 4 a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; Ecclesiastes 3:1-2, 4 (ESV)

Within the Church calendar we may be more somber for a time with our Lord as we learn of His willingness to follow the Father's plan of salvation and we can then rejoice in the resurrection victory in appreciation for the suffering. Just as we observe the seasons of the calendar year and note that each has a different mood so we are free to observe the Church calendar and walk through a variety of seasons in faith with our Lord.

It is interesting that John in his gospel spends half of his writing (more than 10 chapters) about Jesus words and the events of the last week of Jesus life. John has much to convey about the life, ministry and the words of our Lord during this important time of Jesus' life.

May our Lenten journey not be simply gloomy but one that is enriching as you practice and live your everyday faith life. Then as we gather on Easter, we have greater joy and comfort because we have pondered our Lord's journey on our behalf in order to give us the victory. We don't wallow in misery but are preparing for a great and victorious celebration of the resurrection. By the way, the Easter season is also 40 days in length. I'll see you on this journey. Easter is coming soon!

Our next gathering of Grace Book Club will be Sunday, March 24th at 6:30 PM. We will be discussing "Thomas Jefferson: A Biography of Spirit" by Thomas S. Kidd. Our meeting place will be at Lori Hardin's. Thank you to

Lorene for hosting last month's get together. A few of us had not yet finished the book but we were inclined to finish it after hearing feedback from the other attendees. Overall, we enjoyed the book but it wasn't one of our favorites.

A summary: Thomas Jefferson was arguably the most brilliant and inspiring political writer in American history. But the ethical realities of his personal life and political career did not live up to his soaring rhetoric. Indeed, three tensions defined Jefferson's moral life: democracy versus slavery, republican virtue versus dissolute consumption, and veneration for Jesus versus skepticism about Christianity.

In this book Thomas S. Kidd tells the story of Jefferson's ethical life through the lens of these tensions, including an unapologetic focus on the issue where Jefferson's idealistic philosophy and lived reality clashed most obviously: his sexual relationship with his enslaved woman Sally Hemings. In doing so, he offers a unique perspective on one of American history's most studied figures.


Concordia Circle/LWML—


