"NOW AND NOT YET"

May has two important celebration days this year; the Ascension of our Lord and Pentecost. Both of these were part of the early church's big three celebrations along with Easter. (Christmas came later about the third century.) The Ascension of Jesus is a BIG deal. The Easter season is seven weeks long according to the church calendar. (That is because it marks the Biblical 50 days until Pentecost from Easter.) During the first 40 days up until the Ascension, Jesus was showing himself to the disciples to prove that he was alive and teaching how all the Old Covenant was fulfilled in Himself. He wanted them to be very sure of those facts because on the day that he would ascend to heaven bodily he would commission them as his witnesses.

At the 40-day mark during the Easter season Jesus ascends to heaven. The disciples of course are staring up into heaven in awe when the angel appears to them. Ascension is really a critical transition day. It is a "now and not yet" moment. The "now" is that Christ is risen from the dead. The "not yet" portion is because the second great event is still coming. Jesus said wait. Wait in Jerusalem for the Pentecost. Fifty days after Easter (Pente =50) is the empowerment of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit would enable them to accomplish the task given them.

You and I live in a "now and not yet" time. We live in between Christ's first coming for salvation and second coming in judgement and final victory. We know the fruits of salvation, forgiveness, faith, and the assurance of eternal life. Our "not yet" is the knowing and experiencing the fullness of eternal life, the consummation of our salvation. In the mean

time we rejoice in the resurrection but await our own personal resurrection. In the meantime, we have that same task as the disciples. Though we are not physical eyewitnesses of the resurrected Christ, we have the new life, faith and the gift of the Holy Spirit in our lives leading us to the final moment of either our death and resurrection or Christ's visible return. Thus, we can rejoice in the gift of the Holy Spirit calling, gathering and enlightening us in the faith along with all believers throughout the world. In the mean time we wait for Christ's return and work serving our Lord and those around us spreading the great good news.

Because Ascension always falls on a Thursday it is easily overlooked. On Sunday May 12th we will celebrate the Observation of Christ's Ascension and then on May 19th we will celebrate Pentecost. Come and enrich your faith on those special holy days.

<u>A summary:</u> At just under five feet tall, Virginia

Prodan was no match for the towering 6' 10" gunwielding assassin the Romanian government sent to her office to take her life. It was not the first time her life had been threatened--nor would it be the last. As a young attorney under Nicolae Ceausescu's brutal communist regime, Virginia had spent her entire life searching for the truth. When she finally found it in the pages of the most forbidden book in all of Romania, Virginia accepted the divine call to defend fellow followers of Christ against unjust persecution in an otherwise ungodly land. For this act of treason, she was kidnapped, beaten, tortured, placed under house arrest, and came within seconds of being executed under the orders of Ceausescu himself. How Virginia not only managed to elude her enemies time and again, but how she also helped expose the appalling secret that would ultimately lead to the demise of Ceausescu's evil empire is one of the most extraordinary stories ever

Pastor Salemink will be speaking on two chosen topics: Assisted suicide/euthanasia and Sexuality & Gender.

Going Gracefully: A Better End-of-Life Approach Than Assisted Suicide

Assisted suicide has become legal in Canada, California, Colorado, and our nation's capitol. Now Hawaii, Maine, and New Jersey have decriminalized it too. How can Christians compassionately affirm God's gift of life in situations of pain, impairment or advancing age? We'll examine assisted suicide's statistics and solutions, evaluate autonomy, pain, quality of life, and death with dignity, explore the Gospels better way, and offer suggestions for upholding life in congregations and communities.

This Is My Body: Christian Compassion and Courage Concerning Sexuality and Gender

Our culture is wrestling with questions about sexuality and gender. Many of our communities, congregations and families are struggling with these issues as well. How do our bodies reflect and confess the grace of God? For what privileges and responsibilities has He made us male and female? How can we incorporate and care for individuals experiencing suffering and temptation related to sexuality and gender? How may we speak truth and show love in such sensitive situations? We will be motivated by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We will examine instruction from Scripture, engage observations of science, and explore opportunities for servanthood.
