Blessing to all in Christ as "Brothers and Sisters in Christ".



# From our Future Pastor "We Are Family"

Who is in your family? As I was growing up, I thought my family entailed my parents, Jim and Kathy, my sister, Kaelene, and, of course, my grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins. When I married Christa on July 9, 2011, her parents and siblings were included in that family count. My family grew again when we were blessed with each of our four daughters (Shaylene, Kelly, Violet, and Frances). My sister also added to that family by first marrying a brother in the ministry, Pastor Jakob Berger, and then with each of their four children (Daniel, Ida, Lydia, and Hans). I have been blessed with a wonderful family over the years.

A few weeks ago, I had the privilege to preach on these words of Jesus found in Mark 3:31-35, "And [Jesus'] mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, 'Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you.' And he answered them, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother.'" Throughout this book, the author reveals the profound truth that this Jesus is the promised Messiah. One of those ways was by making a family. This family would not be based on one's origin, bloodline, or traditions. It would be solely based on one "doing the will of God."

This leads us to another interesting question: what is God's will? Based on the context, God's will is that all humanity should not reject the Holy Spirit and His message of Jesus. Jesus may appear by some to have lost His mind, but in all reality, He is the One He proclaims. Jesus is the Son of God who has taken upon Himself our flesh to do the will of His Father. Jesus has come to rescue all of us from the house of slavery to sin and death. Jesus accomplishes such a feat by binding up the strongman, the devil, and robbing His possessions, you and me, with His sacrificial death on the cross, in His Baptism, and in His Supper. We receive the promised Holy Spirit and new and eternal life in Him. We are now part of His family forever.

Therefore, it brings us to our initial question: Who is in your family? Well, the people in your family are those brothers and sisters at Grace and fellow believers in Christ. We, Christa, the girls, and I look forward to joining this family at Grace Lutheran Church in Caldwell shortly. As you go about your month, have a blessed time, remembering that Jesus has set you free and has made you part of His forever family!
