### From our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

How do you greet someone? The apostle Paul began each letter in the Bible in one of two different ways. He often began with "grace to you and peace," or in the case of 1 and 2 Timothy, he started "grace, mercy, and peace". Each salutation includes the writer, the recipient, and the greeting proper, which follows the style of other letters of his time. However, his salutations add a new flavor due to the meaning of the words "grace," "mercy," and "peace" for believers in Christ.

When you think of "grace," what comes to mind? Do you think about the hymn written by the slave trader turned Anglican clergy, "Amazing Grace?" Or do you think about the term of the Reformation, "Sola Gratia?" When Paul used the word "grace" here, he referred to God's unmerited and unearned favor and gifts. One of my favorite passages that illustrate "grace" to this world is this apostle's words in Ephesians 2:8-10, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

How about "mercy?" Do you think about that child-hood game where you twist someone's arm until they yell: "MERCY!!!"? Or do you think about a Southern Belle being shocked and saying, "Lord, have mercy?" When you do a word study on "mercy," it carries the idea of God withholding punishment. A good Bible verse to remember is Romans 6:23: "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is

eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Another one is Lamentations 3:22–23: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

Lastly, what about the word "peace?" Do you think about quiet time? Or a time when there is a ceasefire in a war or conflict? The word "peace" comes from the Hebrew word *shalom*. This word carries with it these ideas mentioned, but it carries the idea of completeness or wholeness. That is why Jesus, following His resurrection, greeted His disciples behind locked doors with those words: "Peace be with you!" He does not say it once, but thrice in those words we hear every year on the first Sunday after Easter, John 20:19-31. Therefore, these disciples and you are now at peace and restored to God because of Jesus. Jesus earned it for us out of His life, death, and resurrection. You now have forgiveness of all your sins and eternal life with your Triune God.

Therefore, as I begin my service with you, my brothers and sisters at Grace Lutheran Church, I greet you with these words from Paul's first letter to Timothy: "Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord." Amen.

Some make the mistake of thinking that they can control every detail of their estate, and even levy some level of control after the Lord has called them home. You might call this, "Try-Returning God's Blessings ing to take the joystick with you

into the grave." It just can't be done. When we try to control too much, we rob ourselves of peace, and steal the joy that the Lord meant to have attached to His gifts when He placed them into our lives to manage. Management of God's gifts is less about protecting them, and more about using them, that through His things, God might bless us with His grace in Jesus. That is true for inheritance with family, and it is true for estate support of ministry. Anchored in grace, this work is full of peace and joy. To maintain that sense of peace and joy, we need to understand that the plans we lay out may not last for decades without change. Life changes. Families change. Health changes. Ministries change. Our plans for faithful distribution of God's things also need to change as we move through life.

Gift planning is a problem solver, as it looks at intended distributions, compares current assets, looks to be smart about such things as taxation, and then commits to doing God's work. As you live out your life, be open to the need to make some changes along the way. When do you need to do that? Anytime you sense that you are about to enter, or have just gone through, a major change in your life situation, is the right time to act. It is this unshakable bond between them that both saves their lives and thwarts their futures. Set over the course of five decades, The Dutch House is a dark fairy tale about two smart people who cannot overcome their past.
