"Courage & Strength"

New beginnings are difficult. On August 14th, the girls went back to school. They were scared of what lay ahead of them. The girls were nervous about going to a bigger school that was three times the size of the one they left in Twin Falls. They were going to a place not knowing anyone except a few of the staff members they met when they went on a tour last Spring. Christa was uncertain about what it would be like to teach sixty fifth-graders English and Language Arts. She had not been in the public-school sector since her student teaching. That was thirteen years ago. As for me, I have been trying to get into my routines as the pastor here at Grace Lutheran Church & Preschool. Therefore, when we face these things and try to establish our way of going about things here in Caldwell, I am reminded of those words that appear in Joshua 1:9, "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

The Lord had spoken these words originally to Joshua. This son of Nun was facing his own uncertainties, challenges, and difficulties. Not only had Moses, his beloved mentor, died, but God selected him to be the next leader of the Israelite nation, who were on the verge of the Promised Land. He would lead them into the land and be charged with conquest. Therefore, the Lord said to him more than those words that I just wrote. Hear these words in their original context, Joshua 1:2-9, "Moses my servant is dead. Now therefore arise, go over this Jordan, you and all this people, into the land that I am giving to them, to the people of Israel. Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given to you, just as I promised to Moses. From the wilderness and this Lebanon as far as the great river, the river Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites to the Great Sea toward the going down of the sun shall be your territory. No man shall be able to stand before you all the days of your life. Just as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave you or forsake you. Be strong and courageous, for you shall cause this people to inherit the land that I swore to their fathers to give them. Only be strong and very courageous, being careful to do according to all the law that Moses my servant commanded you. Do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, that you may have good success wherever you go. This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Did you catch what the Lord repeatedly said to His servant? The Lord reiterated not only to "be strong and courageous" twice, but He was always going to be with him. Joshua was not going to face anything alone. What a sense of comfort and peace!

These words of the Lord remind me of another set of words He spoke. He had spoken life and made these individuals His disciples. They were sent out with the Good News that the Lord saves humanity. Therefore, He promised to be with them in their uncertainties, challenges, and difficulties. Jesus spoke to His disciples these words just moments before His ascension back to the right hand of His Father, Matthew 28:18-20, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Like the promise to Joshua from centuries before, Jesus also promised to be always with His disciples. They were not going to face anything, including their future martyrdom alone. The Lord was going through it with them.

What does that mean for us? As we go about our lives, there will be times of regular routines and there will be new uncertainties, challenges, or difficulties. It is easy to forget. It is easy to become stressed and overwhelmed. It is easy to freak out and question and doubt. However, the Lord comes to us. He comes to be with us. For the Lord is our Immanuel, God with us today and forevermore. The Lord still comes to us through His Word and Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. He will never leave us alone. Therefore, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

The strange economy of giving

Does it please God to receive what's already His?

"Every good and perfect gift is from above." James 1:17

It was my mother's birthday, and as a ten-year-old "Mama's boy," I was horrified to realize I hadn't gotten her anything. "Mom, can I borrow a dollar?" I asked. "What do you want it for?" she said. "I can't tell you," I replied. I put the dollar in the pocket of my Rustler jeans and biked to the Family Dollar. I combed the shelves until I found the perfect gift: a small plaque, 7x13 inches. It looked like this:



I know now my mom couldn't have cared less for the plaque's astrological angle, but when I gave it to her, she was thrilled. She swooped me into her arms and kissed me. She would die of cancer two years later, but for a moment, we were happy together.

Years later, I reflected on the strangeness of her reaction that day. It was *her* dollar I spent. She paid for her own birthday present. Yet somehow this unjust economy brought her joy.

God views our giving to others in much the same way. In 2 Corinthians 8:7, Paul urges believers to "excel in this grace of giving." When we do, God's response, like my mother's, is

one of warmth and delight: "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7). If you want to give a present to the Lord, give something to others. But James 1:17 says, "Every good and perfect gift is from above." This means we are all like 10-year-old me, able to give God and others only what He has already graciously given to us. And our gifts aren't always financial in origin because God bestows on us much more than money. 1 Peter 4:10 says, "Use whatever gift you have received to serve others." Think of all God's gifts that can be shared. Think, for example, about love, time, and talent. We hoard each for self-serving purposes, but when we let them flow freely to help others without any thought of gain, God is ecstatic. It is unwise to feel that the gifts we give away come from our personal storehouse. The truth is that everything we give back to God has come from God Himself. King David once donated a fortune worth over \$200 billion dollars. If that happened today, we'd marvel that he would give away so much of "his own money." But that's not what David thought. He said in a prayer to God, "Everything comes from You, and we have given You only what comes from Your hand." He recognized it was never

really his. So should we. I think one reason my mom was so happy with my awkward present is the surprising potential it revealed in her beloved child. Based on my history, she surely expected me to use her money to buy a toy for myself. Breaking that expectation let shine a glimmer of selflessness in her son's heart that was rarely on display. It exposed a shadow of the man she no doubt hoped I would one day become. That made her happy.

God certainly feels all this and more when we cheerfully share the gifts He has generously shared with us.
