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# "Changeless amidst the Change"

As I look at the world around me, things are constantly changing. The leaves on the trees at our house, the road to the church, and elsewhere are changing colors to various yellows, oranges, and reds. They are stunning. Days are getting shorter, meaning less time to do things outdoors. Nights are getting cooler. I will soon have to pack a warmer coat instead of just my windbreaker. The election is right around the corner, and candidates promise changes if they are elected. We live in a world that appears to be constantly changing around us. Sometimes, these changes are for the better, and other times, they seem to be for the worse.

How do you handle changes? Are you one of those individuals who like the old joke, "How many Lutherans does it take to change a lightbulb?" Which comes with the response "Change?" Or are you a person who is the opposite, who has to change constantly, so you have to buy the newest iPhone, Android, computer, or the latest thing? Change is something that affects people in different ways. One thing I have learned by watching my parents, interacting with others, and even myself is that change gets harder and harder. And when change comes, it sometimes brings with it things like stress, anxiety, fear, and doubt. Therefore, how should we deal with all these changes around us?

I think it is essential to turn back once to the Bible. Over the last few months, we have done Bible study on Sunday mornings. We have studied the evidence of the Bible and how we got the Bible today. It has been a fascinating study and has sparked a lot of good discussion from the group. We were continuously reminded by this study's authors and video presenters that this Bible is God's Word. Therefore, what can God's Word tell us about change? When we look at the Bible, we hear things like:

• Exodus 3:14- "God said to Moses, "I am who I am." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'I am has sent me to you."

- Psalm 102:27- "But you are the same, and your years have no end."
- Isaiah 40:8- "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever."
- Malachi 3:6- "For I the Lord do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed."
- Hebrews 13:8- "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

A simple summary of these passages and the rest of Scripture is the God of the universe that never changes, and His Word stays constant.

What does that mean for us? Even when we see all these changes around us and in our own lives and bodies, we can be sure that God is changeless and that His promises He has made to us are secure. Therefore, we can be confident knowing all our sins of thought, word, and deed have been paid in full and forgiven because of Jesus' death on the cross. We can be confident knowing we, believers in Christ, have a future in paradise with God, where "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." And we know that whatever we face ahead, whether good, bad, or indifferent, we do not face alone, for we have a God who is always with us. He loves, cares for, watches over, and leads us back to Himself.

Therefore, as we enter these fall days, rest assured that your changeless God is with you. His promises and gifts, which He gives to you through His Word and each week at church, are secure. They will not change. See you at church!

<u>A summary:</u> Woodrow Wilson Nickel, age 105, feels his life ebbing away. But when he learns giraffes are going extinct, he finds himself recalling the unforget-table experience he cannot take to his grave. It's 1938. The Great Depression lingers. Hitler is threatening Europe, and world-weary Americans long for wonder. They find it in two giraffes who miraculously survive a hurricane while crossing

the Atlantic. What follows is a twelve-day road trip in a custom truck to deliver Southern California's first giraffes to the San Diego Zoo. Behind the wheel is the young Dust Bowl rowdy Woodrow. Inspired by true events, the tale weaves real-life figures with fictional ones, including the world's first female zoo director, a crusty old man with a past, a young female photographer with a secret, and assorted reprobates as spotty as the giraffes. Part adventure, part historical saga, and part coming-of-age love story, *West with Giraffes* explores what it means to be changed by the grace of animals, the kindness of strangers, the passing of time, and a story told before it's too late.



# Preschool News!

#### 4-Year-Old Class

We've had a wonderful start to our new school year. September was spent getting to know our new friends, learning the rules & how to follow directions.

The themes for September were "Apples and Fall." We did our first directed drawing of an apple. Our learning focus was on the letters A, Y & L, the numbers 1, 2, & 3, the circle shape, and the colors yellow and red. We are continuing to work hard on learning all the letters in our names and practice writing them every day. We focused on learning that our scissors, pencils, crayons, & glue are tools and not toys. We talked about germs and how they spread when we touch our mouth and nose without washing our hands. We used glitter as our pretend germs and put some on each child's hands so they could see where their "germs" went as they touched things. We made apple crafts and even did an apple taste test.

Our bible focus: Week 1 & 2 we learned all about how God created our world in 7 days. Week 3 we learned about the first sin of Adam and Eve how they didn't follow God's rule and then made a tricky bead snake to remind us to always make good choices. Week 4 was about how Noah talked to God and built an ark to put his family and animals in to survive the flood that God sent. We also made our own ark like Noah in the shape of our hand and a beautiful rainbow. We then talked to our friends about how many people they had in each of their families. Our bible verses for the month were... "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." - Genesis 1:1 & "Listen to my instruction and be wise." Proverbs 8:33a.

#### 3-Year-Old Class

September was a fun month for beginning school. The themes of last month included God's 7 days of creation. First day, was how God created light, Day 2 God created the sky and the sea. Day 3 He crated land, trees, and plants. Day 4 God created, the sun, moon, and stars, Day 5 God created the fish and birds, Day 6 God created people and animals. Day 7 God rested. We will be sending home books that you can read to your child on creation and posters to color.

We have been focused on learning the class rules and using our tools in the classroom. The first week we colored our book about tools. We introduced pencils, scissors, glue stick, and crayons. We have worked on our five senses, sight, smell, taste, sound, and touch. The first week we introduced the sense of touch through play dough and the rice tray. Second week we explored taste with a cookie (sweet), unsweetened chocolate (bitter), a lemon (sour) and a pretzel (salty). What did your child find that they liked or did not like? The third week we on smelling (cinnamon, peppermint, lemon and orange). We work on sound the last week. Ask your child what did they listen too? Did they hear rice, rocks, or beans? Did they hear a piano, a dog, or a fire truck? Oh what fun we had using our senses. We worked on our letters Aa, Ll, and Yy, numbers 1,2,3 and colors, red & yellow.

We read Brown Bear Brown Bear What did you see? We used our painted Brown Bear characters to act out the story. We also worked with Mat Man. They watched their teacher build a body with wood pieces and then each child had fun creating their own bodies.

If you have time, stop by and look at our creation bulletin board. You will see the projects that your child created for the board. You will see patterns, crafts and paintings.

We are so grateful for your amazing children that give it their all in participating in our classroom.
