# "A New Name & A New Year"

What's with a name? We were very particular when Christa and I picked our four daughters' names. Their first and middle names had to be two syllables each, and "lene" or "leen" had to be used somewhere in their name. Therefore, our daughters ended up with those two things, from the oldest down to the youngest. Are we the only individuals particular about names? I would have to say "no."

When God gives a name, He has a plan in mind. In the Bible, God gave names to various things and individuals. When He created everything, He named things like day, night, sky, land, and the seas. He entrusts this naming ability to Adam. However, later on in Genesis, we hear that God continues to give names. This time, He gives them to people. This was true for the first patriarch, Abram, and his wife, Sarai, who God had promised a child in the nations of the earth were blessed. Therefore, thirteen years after Ishmael was born, God reaffirmed His covenant with His servant named Abram. Unlike other previous times, this time, God gave him both a sign; in this case, it was circumcision as well as changing his name. We were told about three name changes in Genesis 17. In verse 5, Abram, meaning "high father," became known as Abraham, meaning "father of a multitude." Later in verse 15, God also changed this man's wife, Sarai's name, meaning "my princess," to Sarah, meaning "mother of nations." God was retelling Abraham that He would give him a son through Sarah. Even this son of theirs, Isaac, was given the name by God because this old couple laughed at the thought of having a child of 100 and 90. As a result, in verses 17:18-19, we were told that this promised son would be named "Isaac." It means "he laughs." And even the last of the patriarchs named Jacob, which means "heel grabber" or "usurper," has his name by the Lord. In Genesis 32:28, what occurred after this one wrestling with God one evening. His name was changed to "Israel," which means "a man who wrestles with God." God named each one for a specific purpose.

Why do I mention these names that God gave people? On January 1<sup>st</sup>, the church remembers the Promised One who comes from this family line and is given his name by the Lord. Hear these words again from the verse directly before last week's Gospel Reading, Luke 2:21, "And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb." And Jesus lived up to His name of Jesus, which means "Ya saves." Jesus saves us people from our sins and eternal condemnation. We are now forgiven and granted eternal life and the wedding banquet.

And it is due to Jesus and all that He has done, that our name changed. Hear these words of the prophet Isaiah, 62:1-5, "For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, for Jerusalem's sake I will not remain quiet, till her vindication shines out like the dawn, her salvation like a blazing torch. The nations will see your vindication, and all kings your glory; you will be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will bestow. You will be a crown of splendor in the Lord's hand, a royal diadem in the hand of your God. No longer will they call you Deserted, or name your land Desolate. But you will be called Hephzibah, and your land Beulah; for the Lord will take delight in you, and your land will be married. As a young man marries a young woman, so will your Builder marry you; as a bridegroom rejoices over his bride, so will your God rejoice over you." Unlike cities that are given new names after being conquered or when they are rebuilt, people are renamed to signify they are a new authority or to confirm covenant promises. And that is what is going on with her. God, through Jesus, has made us His "holy people" and "Yahweh's redeemed people," as well as "Sought After" and "A City Not Abandon." This renaming signifies a new relation between the Lord and His people.

Therefore, as we embark on this new year, go forward with our Triune God that has made us His people when we were baptized "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" and goes with us in whatever we face.




