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"Three Beloveds"

Many individuals will do various things this month to express their love. Recent studies found that:

- Consumers will spend close to \$192 to celebrate their Valentine.
- Roughly 6 million people get engaged on Valentine's Day.
- Around 224 million roses are grown specifically for Valentine's Day
- Chocolate contributed \$2.5 billion to the total \$4.1 billion in seasonal valentine sales.

These statistics and others show that love is related to spending money on gifts such as rings, roses, and chocolate. However, these and other gifts of love in this world will eventually tarnish, be consumed, or wilt. As a result, expressions of love in this world are often fleeting.

When we open our Bibles with the concept of "love," we discover something profoundly moving. The first use of the word "love" highlights the deep bond between a father and his son. In Genesis 22:2, we hear the heartfelt words spoken by the Lord to Abraham: "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." The word "love" comes from the Hebrew word "aheb," which translates to a general type of love, akin to how we might express our affection for our partners, children, or cherished pets. Yet, before Abraham was to follow through with such a heart-wrenching task, the Lord intervened by sending the Angel of the Lord to stop him. Instead of Isaac, a ram was provided as a substitute. Genesis 22:13 says, "And Abraham lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, behind him was a ram, caught in a thicket by his horns." Abraham's heart must have been greatly relieved as he took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering instead of his beloved son. What an incredible and touching story!

This story of Abraham and Isaac foreshadows the beautiful expressions of love found in the New Testament. In the Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke—the first use of "love" again portrays the relationship between a Father and a Son, this time during Jesus' baptism. In Matthew 3:16-17, we read, "And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened

to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a voice from heaven said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." The term "beloved" translates from the Greek word "agapetos," which conveys a deep, unconditional love. This time, the Son would be the sacrifice—not as a substitute, but as a selfless offering. Jesus is introduced to us as the Lamb of God. who comes to take away the sins of the world. Not only that, but this lineage of love extends to John's first use is found in 3:16, where we discover God's incredible compassion: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." Jesus will bring such forgiveness and eternal life by fulfilling what He said in John 15:13, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends." Unlike Isaac, Jesus faced this sacrifice without a substitute. His loving act of laying down His life on the cross, followed by His glorious resurrection three days later, ensures that forgiveness and everlasting life. What a powerful testament to unconditional love!

How do these gifts become our own? This leads us to our third and final beloved. In our own baptism, we, sons of Adam and daughters of Eve, become something wonderful. We become God's beloved children. For it is there where we are born again, born above, by the water and the Spirit. God showers us with His love, forgiveness, and salvation. Hear these beautiful words of reminder that 1 John 3:1-3, "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is. And everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure." Unlike the gifts of worldly love, the love of God lasts far beyond Valentine's Day. It lasts forever!



A summary: Nine Parts of Desire is the story of Brooks' intrepid journey toward an understanding of the women behind the veils, and of the often contradictory political, religious, and cultural forces that shape their lives. Defying our stereotypes about the Muslim world, Brooks' acute analysis of the world's fastest growing religion deftly illustrates how Islam's holiest

texts have been misused to justify repression of women, and how male pride and power have warped the original message of a once liberating faith. As a prizewinning foreign correspondent for The Wall Street Journal, Geraldine Brooks spent six years covering the Middle East through wars, insurrections, and the volcanic upheaval of resurgent fundamentalism. Yet for her, headline events were only the backdrop to a less obvious but more enduring drama: the daily life of Muslim women.

Preschool News!

4-Year-Old Class

January

/ was

about celebrating all things winter! We welcomed the kids back with a New Year's Glow Party. The kids wore neon colors, we colored a 2025 picture with neon/highlighter markers, blew up neon balloons and then watched it all glow in dark with our black lights! We learned about arctic animals and how they live in the cold weather. Our science experiment this month was to cover our hands in Crisco and put them in ice cold water to see if we could feel the cold. This was to show the kids how arctic animals extra blubber keeps them warm in the arctic waters. We made snowflakes, penguins, snowy owls, polar bears and played in water beads and ice. We read "Sneezy the Snowman" and then had fun creating our own "melted snowman" and saying why they thought their snowmen melted. The kids have been working hard on practicing writing letters and sounds. Our learning focus was on the letters P, C, and S, the numbers 12 to 14, the star shape and the colors white and gray.

January Bible Verses: "Whoever believes will be saved." - Mark 16:16 & "God is an everlasting Rock." - Isaiah 26:4. We focused on the stories about John the Baptist, Jesus' Baptism, Fishers of Men, The Lord's Prayer & House on the Rock. We made a craft out of construction paper for the kids to demonstrate John baptizing Jesus. We made fun fish out of Cd's and paper and made bracelets to remind us of the Lord's Prayer. We learned about how a house built on rocks is sturdier than one on sand by doing our own experiment and watching how water washed away the sand and made the house fall and the one on rocks didn't fall down.

Our class has re-found our rhythm after Christmas Break, and we have enjoyed being back in the classroom with our littles. With the playground having been under construction, as well as the frigid weather Brrrr, we have spent extra time indoors in January crafting, painting winter clothes, and learning the skill of lacing mittens all to include our learning focus of winter. The kids adore BIG story books that we have incorporated during our circle time and often choose to forfeit free play time to be read to instead. Planes, trains, and automobiles and all things transportation were also a learning focus. The kids enjoyed being a train transporting their items of choice, most definitely while shouting "CHOO CHOO", and hearing "ALL ABOARD!" We have kept on and continue using their "smart finger" to follow along with the words in short story books as they followed directives to color the various types of cars in different colors and ended with their own attempt to draw their very own idea of a train car on the final page in their book. They also practiced learning to sort train cars by color and with encouraged effort did an amazing job to line them out in groupings. We shared Jesus as a boy and his being lost in the Temple, playing hide and go find to have them explore how it must have felt to lose something, or someone, important and how happy Mary must have felt when she found her lost son. We fished and talked about disappointment when we don't catch annuny fish and trusting Jesus when we are frustrated. Then we talked about how Jesus provided fish because Simon and Peter trusted and obeyed, and that He wants each of us to also to be "Fishers Of Men" in sharing Jesus by asking those around us to follow and fish for Jesus, too. Our Bible verse for January was "Jesus grew in wisdom and the grace of God was upon Him" Luke 2:40. Our colors were white and gray, our shape was a star, our letters were Pp, Cc, Ss, and our numbers were 12, 13, and 14.

We look forward to February as we continue to LOVE on these littles and find joy in their love for learning!
