

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"Jesus, Son of David"

Our family loves attending parades. The girls enjoy getting the various treats offered and participating in the festivities. Meanwhile, Christa appreciates the atmosphere surrounding such events. As for me, I want to see if I recognize anyone there and observe how people interact with one another. Over the years, our family has attended several of them.

When we read through the Gospel accounts, the closest we come to experiencing a parade is what many individuals call Jesus' Triumphant Entry. It tells about how Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey on the Sunday before His crucifixion. Huge crowds that had come up to Jerusalem for Passover welcomed Jesus like one of their ancient kings, waving palm branches and laying down their cloaks. There are numerous cross-references to events, people, and fulfillments occurring at that moment. However, with limited space, I will dedicate the remainder of this article to what the crowd first cried out to Jesus on Palm Sunday. Hear these words in Matthew 21:9, "Hosanna! Hosanna to the Son of David!"

"Hosanna" is a Hebrew phrase that was originally a prayer. It comes from two Hebrew words: "yasha" (save, help, deliver) and "na" (please, now). Therefore, when the crowd is crying out to Jesus on that Sunday, they are saying: "Save us now! Deliver us, please!" Some scholars believe this cry traces back to Psalm 118:25-26, "Save us, we pray, O Lord! O Lord, we pray, give us success! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! We bless you from the house of the Lord." These words would be already on their lips. According to one source I read, "In its ancient Jewish context, Psalm 118 was more likely an entrance liturgy to the Temple, used at the festival of Passover. It proclaimed God's deliverance from Egypt and, later on, from the exile." Many of the Jews during this time of Jesus were seeking the Lord's deliverance once again. This time, they were seeking deliverance from those pagan Romans.

Next, the crowd bestows upon Jesus the title of "Son of David." When they use this title, they are saying something more than He is an offspring of David. They are saying that Jesus is the long-awaited One that the Lord had promised to David

through the prophet Nathan, which is recorded in 2 Samuel 7:12-16, "When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son. When he commits iniquity, I will discipline him with the rod of men, with the stripes of the sons of men, but my steadfast love will not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away from before you. And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever." Therefore, they were excited to see what Jesus would do.

When Jesus does not lead an uprising against the Romans, they take Him through the gate once again five days later, this time with cries of "Crucify him! Crucify him!" They bring Him up the hill of Golgotha and crucify Him. Although these events may not seem significant, this Son of David, who is also the Son of God, answers the cries of those in Jerusalem and the cries of all humanity. Jesus saves and delivers us from something greater than just a foreign oppressor. He goes to the cross to die and then rises again, in order to save us from all our sins, the eternal death we deserve, and the clutches of the devil. Therefore, we have forgiveness, life, and salvation under Jesus, who reigns forever. The Lord answers our plea, "Hosanna, save us," through this Son of David and Son of God, named Jesus, which means "Ya saves" or "the Lord saves." You are now saved! Amen.

Come and join us this Holy Week to hear, once again, all that Jesus has done for us.



As we continue to think about the tensions involved in Christian estate planning, this month we focus on how differences in opinion among family can create enough roadblocks to keep a plan from moving forward.

Imagine a husband and wife who have children, who have wandered into difficulties in their lives. Dad is the softy, just wanting to make their children's lives easier. Mom is stricter, demanding the children take responsibility for their behaviors. At times, this difference has created strain on their Returning God's Blessings marital relationship.

Now imagine this same couple trying to jointly decide on a solid Christian estate plan. Dad wants to evenly divide the estate as lump sum inheritance between their three children. Mom wants to spread inheritance over time. She also believes that her children will waste resources given to them, so she is motivated to support gifts for ministry. You can imagine that the typical response to this tension is avoidance. As a result, their last estate documents are forty years old, created before their children were born.

For this couple, the key will be to have open, prayerful discussion about their goals, looking to create a consensus about what is the Lord's will for use of His things.

Your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can assist in a situation like this. While they aren't a marriage counselor, they can safely ask some questions that the couple has been avoiding. 
